Eat Dirt Off Road Cycling Event

Exmoor Mountain Bike enthusiasts, British Cycling, and Calvert Trust Exmoor have joined forces to hold a fantastic Mountain Bike Event on May Bank Holiday, 2nd May. "Eat Dirt on Exmoor" will offer 2 routes of 14 or 23 miles, through stunning scenery. Much of the route is not normally open to the public; Calvert Trust Exmoor are grateful to the Hollam, New Invention and Broford Estates for allowing special access for this event. It will start and end in Dulverton. Passing through the Barle valley, the route runs up to Tarr Steps. From there the route climbs up onto the moor, with far reaching views in all directions, before heading south east to Exe and then back into Dulverton for the finish line.

New coach service to Plymouth and to Bristol 24/7

The South West Falcon is a coach service from Stagecoach connecting Plymouth, Exeter, Taunton, Bristol Airport and Bristol City Centre. The Falcon flies up the A38/M5 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

All Falcon coaches have free Wi-Fi. USB charging points, power sockets and air conditioning so you can work, rest or play whilst on the move. Coaches have wheelchair space however this must be pre-booked at least a week before travel. There are 19 journeys a day, 7 days a week. The main stops are: Plymouth (Bretonside), Drumbridges, Exeter (Honiton Road & Sowton Park & Ride) Cullompton (Weary Traveller), Taunton (Black brook Park Ave), Bridgwater (Huntworth Lane M5, J24), Brent Knoll (Fox & Goose), Churchill Inn, Bristol Airport. Falcon fares start from £5 return for under 25s and concessionary pass holders. You can also now book seats via megabus.com where prices start from as little as £1 (+50p booking fee). Buy a group return for up to 5 people travelling together - only twice the price of an adult return. If you're using Falcon regularly our 1 and 4 week ticket options will save you money. These will all be issued on Stagecoach Smart cards so you can reuse them again and again. Buy your 1 and 4 week tickets from the driver. Sorry, concessionary passes are not valid for free travel on Falcon. This is an express coach link for long distance journeys, local journeys (under 15 miles) cannot be made. 

From North Devon to the Middle East

A new exhibition at the Museum of Barnstaple and N Devon offers a unique insight into the experiences of local heroes in the First World War. The exhibition, which runs until 9 April, showcases the experiences of the 6th Battalion of the Devonshire Regiment in Mesopotamia during WWI, as seen through the eyes of artist and soldier Sergeant Vernon C.Boyle. He was a member of the 6th Devons and travelled from North Devon to Mesopotamia (now modern Iraq) and to India during the Great War. There he produced a vast collection of sketches and watercolours, which have been generously loaned to the museum by his grandchildren. The images range from the smoke-filled cafes of Baghdad through to the mountains of Darjeeling, from quick sketches of local life through to completed paintings of the magnificent architecture of the Middle East. The Museum is open from 10am to 4pm on Monday to Saturday, admission is free

New project focuses on rural dementia

Dementia is a growing health problem, with an anticipated increase in the number of cases of 156% between now and 2051, according to statistics from the Alzheimer's Society. This is two million people, and the burden will fall on rural areas where there are significantly higher proportions of elderly people, so the burden will impact communities and the rural economy, yet little is known about how it will manifest itself and what kind of specialist care networks will needed.

"Farming, Dementia and Networks of Care" is the first project of its kind to focus specifically on farming communities and dementia. Its results will be useful for healthcare and service providers, and academics researching the condition. Funded by the Seale Hayne Educational Trust, the project will be carried out by Dr Richard Yarwood and Dr Claire Kelly from the School of Geography, Earth and Environmental Sciences. They will be guided by a steering group including Joanne Jones from the Farming Community Network and chaired by Ian Sherriff, of Plymouth University.

The project will begin as a pilot in Devon and will investigate how farmers, their families and carers cope when they are affected by dementia. There are three main objectives: to consider the impact of dementia on farming businesses; to evaluate how dementia affects farming families and communities, and to consider how agencies can support farming families with dementia. Ian Sherriff, who is also a member of the Prime Minister's Task and Finish Group on Rural Dementia, said, "As someone totally committed to helping society tackle the many challenges that people with dementia and their carers face daily, I am really excited that Plymouth University has been awarded funding research the issues and challenges that people with dementia and their carers face in the farming community."
